1.0 Introduction


Cwmni CELyn was recently commissioned by Llandwrog Community Council to lead on the work of developing a community consultation questionnaire, arranging distribution of the questionnaire, analysing the results and producing a report. The questionnaires were posted to all households within the Llandwrog Community Council post code area during March 2019 with the option of completing an online version or returning a paper version by pre-paid envelope.

Overall, a good response was received, 403 responses in total (331 were paper responses and 72 online responses). There were almost 300 comments provided by respondents, which have been grouped by village. It is also notable that some villages will have different concerns and priorities to others e.g speeding vs litter vs parking vs dog mess.


2.0 ResultsMap of Villages and volume of responses (Larger the circle the more responses):



Q1. In which area do you live?




Q2. What is your age?




A low proportion of the responses were completed by residents of 35 yrs of age and younger (9% in total). The Council may wish to consider how this age group can be engaged in future campaigns. The older the age group the more responses were received.

Q3. Do you know who your Community Councillor is?




Almost half (49%) of respondents did not know who their Community Concillor was (a slightly better response was reveived from Groeslon residents with 47% noting 'yes').

Q4. Do you know how to contact your Community Councillor?




57% of respondents noted that they did not know how to contact their Community Councillor. A few commented that they could probably find out via a quick internet search if they needed to find out, however the overall response confirms that more could be done to inform residents of who are their Councillors and how to contact them.

Q5. Would you like to know and learn more about the work of Llandwrog Community Council?



This is an extremely encouraging response, 71% of respondents noted that they wished to learn more about the work of the Community Council.

Q6 If your answer was 'Yes' in question 5, how would you like to receive this?




The Newsletter was the preferred method of communicating the Council's work, however there were also comments by a number of respondents suggesting that using existing channels and zero-cost options should be prioritised e.g Papur Bro Lleu and Website. Facebook was the second preferred option, which is encouraging considering that less respondents than expected completed the survey online.

Q7. Llandwrog Community Council is responsible for OR is able to influence the following matters. In your opinion, which are most important for the Community Council to prioritise?

It is difficult to visually show the results of this question in a single graph. With 11 villages, 15 categories, and 5 different levels of importance within the categories there is a lot of data to analyse.

Therefore, although the below graph shows the results for all responses, the next section of the report splits the responses by village for a more accurate reflection of local feelings.



Overall, road conditions and public transport was the main priority for many respondents, followed by roadside litter and dog mess. The survey was circulated at a time when local bus services were under threat and a major bus operator had recently given notice of their withdrawal from many routes.

As to what was not so important, many respondents noted Village Noticeboards (comments noted that Village Facebook pages are more popular), Salt bins and Grants to Organisations (which could be attributed to lack of awareness as to what this entailed and who would benefit).
















